SAUL T. DE VRIES

Labor Attaché



Saul is presently the Labor Attaché and Head of the Migrant Workers Office of the Philippine Embassy in Washington, D.C.

He is distinguished by more than three decades of public service experience. He joined the government service in 1989 and established a track record in labor policy research, migration-related program development and implementation, and overseas labor operations.

He started his career in government as Research Assistant at the Institute for Labor Studies (ILS), the policy research arm of the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE). For 15 years at ILS, he was involved in the conduct of countless policy research in such areas as child labor, social protection, and labor-management relations. Some of his research

outputs saw print in the publications of the ILS, the International Labor Organization (ILO) and other institutions. He left ILS in 2004 as a Division Chief.

Saul entered the field of international labor migration in 2004 when he joined the Overseas Workers Welfare Administration (OWWA), an attached agency of DOLE. He served as Regional Director in four OWWA Regional Welfare Offices, namely, Region VI (2004-2006), Region II (2008), Cordillera Administrative Region (2009-2010) and National Capital Region (2010). He also served as Deputy Director of the National Reintegration Center for OFWs (2010-2011).

He was also designated Welfare Officer and headed the OWWA offices in the Philippine Embassy in Tokyo (2006-2008) and in Washington, D.C. (2011-2014). In 2014, he was recalled to Manila to serve as Director of the International Labor Affairs Bureau (ILAB) of DOLE, which is responsible for developing policies, plans, programs, projects and operating standards on international labor and employment concerns.

In 2016, Saul was appointed Labor Attaché and sent to Washington, DC where he served as Head of the Philippine Overseas Labor Office (POLO) of the Philippine Embassy until 2018. He was transferred to Singapore where he served in the same capacity until 2021.

Prior to his return to Washington, DC in 2023, Saul served as OIC-Director of the International Migrant Workers Policy and Cooperation Bureau of the Department of Migrant Workers (DMW); and Head of the Bilateral Labor Review Committee Secretariat of the DOLE.

Saul was also member of various Philippine delegations in international conferences and meetings including the International Labor Conferences in Geneva (2014, 2016); Abu Dhabi Dialogue Meetings in Kuwait (2014); Colombo Process Meeting in Sri Lanka (2014); APECHRD Working Group Meeting in Vietnam (2014) and Peru (2016); United Nations conferences and meetings in New York on large movements of refugees and migrants (2016), persons with disabilities (2016), status of women (2016), and contributions of migrants and diasporas to sustainable development (2017).

Victoria Parent is an award-winning teacher working with Chesterfield County Public Schools. She is the daughter of Sarah and George Parent and granddaughter of Dolores Vautier. Victoria is the leader of her school's 10th grade English Professional Learning Community, sponsor of multiple student organizations, and recipient of multiple awards and grants since starting her teaching career in 2018. In 2022, Victoria earned her National Board Certification, the teaching profession's most respected and rigorous professional certification. Her teaching philosophy is rooted in fostering empathy and civic activism through inquiry, expanding worldviews through cultural studies, and improving schools to be culturally responsive, safe spaces for students to thrive.

Victoria and her family have been active members of the Filipino American Association of Stafford Virginia since her early adolescent years. From volunteering at the Thurman Brisben Homeless Shelter, to the annual Christmas party, and eventually participating in the 2014 Filipina Pageant, Victoria has fond memories with FAASV growing up. She credits the organization with helping her form strong cultural ties to her Filipina identity and teaching her about the importance of community— two ideals that inform and inspire Victoria's professional and personal practices to this day.

FAASV provided invaluable financial and community-centered support during Victoria's collegiate experience at the University of Mary Washington, where she earned her Bachelor of Arts in English in 2017 and her Master of Education in Secondary English in 2018. At UMW, Victoria ran varsity track and cross country for the Eagles while also working as a nationally certified communication consultant with the UMW Speaking Center. She was awarded honors as an NCAA Academic All-American in 2014, the Outstanding Senior Service Award from the Department of English, Linguistics, and Communication in 2017, and graduated Summa Cum Laude with departmental honors.

Victoria is committed to growing as a professional and contributing to the larger conversations about education to create a better system for our students. Victoria recently worked with Virginia Commonwealth University to conduct research on culturally responsive teaching practices, contributed to professional publications, spoke at conferences, and facilitated panel discussions centered around this vital pedagogical approach to teaching and learning. Additionally, Victoria was a 2020 recipient of the Book Love Foundation's Classroom Library grant, a 2023 Teacher of the Year Finalist, and most notably, a 2022 R.E.B. Award Winner for Teaching Excellence. The R.E.B. Award provided the opportunity for Victoria to visit the Philippines, South Korea, and Japan, where she aimed to learn more about the Asian American experience in order to amplify Asian voices in the classroom and prove insight into the nuances, complexity, and beauty of the Asian diaspora.
